### **Looking In Our Grandparents' Closet**

New museum exhibit opens on November 30, 2023



You are invited to attend the grand opening of our new museum exhibit, "Looking In Our Grandparents' Closet", on Thursday, November 30, 2023 in the Okada Building. A formal blessing and ribbon cutting ceremony will be followed by the official viewing of the displays. This event is free and open to the public; please RSVP by calling our office at 808-677-0110.

The exhibit was created and installed by Yoshiko Yamauchi and Donna Wong with the help of many of our volunteers. It includes artifacts and clothing donated and stored in our museum archives over the past 30 years. Featured are ethnic wear and clothing worn in daily life during the 1900s by Hawaiian, Chinese, Portuguese, Puerto Rican, Japanese, Okinawan, Korean and Filipino sugar plantation workers and their descendants.

The theme for the exhibit started with a generous donation of a spinning wheel from Mrs. Beverly Keever. On a spinning wheel, a variety of nature's fibers were spun from cotton, pineapple, grass and silk and woven into cloth. The display showcases clothing made from these fibers. Interesting personal stories and life experiences were shared with garments donated and on loan to HPV.

Imagine yourself on the sailing ship with only a trunk of your belongings and arriving to a strange place where you know no one or have no family. See what grandma used for laundry day - aluminum tubs, water jugs, scrub boards, soap to padded wooden ironing board and heavy gas iron. Step back in time and take a peek into our grandparents' closet.

### WATERCRESS

Watercress grows year round in the artesian spring waters in our taro lo'i.



It is said to have cancer-fighting properties and provides more iron than spinach, more calcium than whole milk and more vitamin C than oranges and has amazing health benefits.

It is high in calcium, carotenes, folic acid, zinc, iron and vitamins A, B, C and E. It helps in reducing eczema and wrinkles, maintaining strong bones and protecting against stroke, heart disease and cataracts.

### **Recipe:**

### Watercress Salad

Remove stems from 2 large bunches of watercress, tear to bite-size. Soften <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup dried cranberries by adding to <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup orange juice and microwave for 1 minute, let cool. Toss watercress in a balsamic vinaigrette dressing to coat. Garnish with the softened cranberries and 1 cup toasted slivered almonds. Makes 4 servings.




