### What's Blooming in the Village: Coffee (Coffea)



Coffee was first introduced to Hawai<sup>4</sup> i in 1825 by High Chief Boki. The fruits of the coffee plant are called coffee cherries. The seeds are known as the coffee beans. Ripe red coffee cherries are edible. It is recommended to remove the skin first as it adds a bitter taste if it is left on when you eat it. The taste of a ripe cherry is sweet and reminiscent of the lychee fruit.

Early Puerto Rican immigrants that came to Hawai'i to work on the sugar plantations, came from coffee farming areas. In the Puerto Rican area of the village, there are two coffee trees. In the Puerto Rican kitchen, there is a large wooden piló or mortar and pestle that was used to mash the ripe red coffee cherries to get the coffee beans. On the wall of the kitchen above the piló is a coffee bean grinder. Near the table is a ladle made of la'amia, that was used to dole out coffee into each person's cup. Sugar from the sugar plantation where the Puerto Ricans worked was used to sweeten the coffee.
