#### Hechima



Okinawans call it *nabera*, and Chinese refer to it as *see kwa*. It is a gourd that is cooked like a squash, stir fried or in soups. Left to dry on the vine produces loofah, which immigrants used to scrub their pots. Come see it at the Okinawan house.
